Access to washrooms, good hygiene and safe water, is fundamental not only to good health but a good life. When we consider that a single gram of feces from an infected person can contain trillions disease-causing microorganisms and that millions of people are forced to defecate in open areas, it is not surprising that half of the people, many of them children, living in urban areas of Africa have a disease associated with poor sanitation, hygiene, and water. The Love Africa Project is constructing public washrooms so that communities can look optimistically to a future that is healthy and full of opportunities.

Our first project is well on its way to completion! Love Africa is building a 20-toilet public washroom structure in Saltpond. We believe this costal village in the Central Region of Ghana could be a beautiful and lucrative area for tourism and that the installation of our washroom is the first step towards that success.

Construction is completed all the way to roof height and we have acquired the materials needed to complete the roofing, plumbing and door installations. We have invested about \$6,500 to get us to this point and estimate that we need just \$5,000 more to complete this transformational structure of health and hope.

Health Impacts of Sanitation

- Lack of sanitation leads to disease. As recently as 2007, sanitation was declared as the most important *medical* milestone.
- Of the diseases associated with poor sanitation, 10% of the global burden of disease and are directly related to poverty and illnesses.
- Close to half of the urban populations of Africa have a disease associated with poor sanitation, hygiene, and water.
- Not properly disposing properly of faeces is incredibly dangerous to the health of entire communities.
- One gram of fresh faeces from an infected person can contain trillions of disease-causing micro-organisms.
- The safe disposal of faeces is critical in preventing the spread of disease.
- Half of the people living in urban areas of Africa have a disease associated with poor sanitation, hygiene, and water.
- 50% of those in Africa do not have access to sanitation.
